SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RACE RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing and by Italian Sailing Federation Normativa per l'attività agonistica 2020.
- 1.2 In the event of a conflict between the NOR and the sailing instructions, these will prevail to modify RRS 63.7"
- 1.3 Competitors may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority
- 1.4 The official language is the English language.

2 NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board online available at the following url https://www.campioneunivela.it/en/regattas/2021/eurocup-flying-dutchman/

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted one (1) hour before the first scheduled race of the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races, that will be posted by 8.00 p.m. on the day before it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the official flagpole, located near the Race Office.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 (fortyfive) minutes' in the race signal AP.
- 4.3 When flag Y is displayed ashore, rule 40 applies at all times while afloat. This changes the Part 4 preamble.







5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Races are scheduled as follows:

Day Program

07/05/2021 Registrations hr. 9:00 – 11:00

First Warning Signal hr.13:00

08/05/2021 First Warning Signal hr.TBD 09/05/2021 First Warning Signal hr.TBD

- 5.2 Races after the first of the day shall be communicated by Race Committee.
- 5.3 9 (nine) races are scheduled. A maximum of 3 (three) races per day may be held.
- 5.4 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 4:30 p.m..
- 5.5 Regatta will be valid if 1 (one) or more races shall be disputed.

6 CLASS FLAGS

6.1 Class flags will be K flag (International Code).

7 RACING AREA

7.1 The race will be held in front of the Organizing Club as shown in Attachment B.

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The diagram in Attachment A show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 A shortened course shall contain at least 2 legs. (In case of course n.1 the offset 1-2 shall not be considered as a leg). This changes rule 32.

9 MARKS

9.1 Marks 1-2-3 will be red. Finishing mark will be orange.

10 THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started according to rule 26, with the warning signal made five (5) minutes before the starting signal. The warning signal will be the International Code flag "K".
- 10.2. At least 5 minutes before the "Warning" is up, the orange flag will be displaid with 1 sound.

Pre-Start	Orange Flag	1 sound	> -10 min
Warning	Class Flag (Letter "K")	1 sound	-5 min,
Preparatory	Flag P or I or U or Black	1 sound	-4 min
Last Minute	Preparatory signal lowered	1 sound	-1 min.
Start	Class Flag lowered	1 sound	0 min

10.3 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting mark at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark or a orange flag, displayed on the contro-starter boat.







11 THE FINISH

- 11.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the finishing boat and the finishing mark.
- 11.2 The target time for each race is 50 minutes
- 11.3 The competitors that will finish 15 minutes after the arrival of the first competitor will be considered DNF.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 The Scoring Penalty, rule 44.1 and 44.2, will apply.
- 12.2 The time limit to present a protest is 60 minutes after the finish of the last competitor of the last race of the day .

13 SCORE

- 13.1 The scoring system is as follows: Low Point System as per Appendix A RRS.
- 13.2 9 (nine) races are scheduled for the event.
- 13.3 When fewer than 4 (four) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores
- 13.4 When 4 (four) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 14.1 All sailors must wear a buoyancy aid when racing
- 14.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

15 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 15.1 Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the race committee.
- 15.2 Each boat shall have a valid measurement certificate and shall accomplish with class measurement rules. All hulls and sails shall be already measured.

16 EVENT ADVERTISING

16.1 Advertising is free, according with Class Rules. As per ISAF Regulation 20, boats can be requested to display event advertising supplied by the organizing authority.

17 PRIZES

17.1 Prizes will be given as in the NOR.

18 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

18.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

19 INSURANCE


19.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1.500.000€ per incident or the equivalent.
